henry sidgwick is one of the great intellectual figures of 19th century britain he was first and foremost a great moral philosopher whose masterwork methods of ethics is still widely studied today but he was many other things besides writing on religion economics politics education and literature he was deeply involved in the founding of first college for women at the university of
