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entre 1967 y 1997 george steiner escribió para the new yorker más de 150 artículos y reseñas sobre gran variedad de asuntos haciendo que ideas difíciles y temas poco familiares resultaran atrayentes no sólo para los intelectuales sino también para el gran público a steiner le interesan tanto la inglaterra de la segunda guerra mundial el búnker de hitler y el mundo caballeresco como céline bernhard cioran beckett borges chomsky brecht o el historiador espía anthony blunt en estos artículos sorprendentes por su vívida sencillez así como profundamente instructivos por su dominio de campos muy diferentes steiner nos ofrece una guía ideal que abarca desde la literatura del gulag o la enorme importancia de george orwell hasta la historia del ajedrez

this is an extraordinary collection of essays by one of this country s most exciting and dramatic thinkers the essays span a considerable time but they turn on a central compelling theme what is meant by reading a serious text at a time when theories of

language and literature question the very possibility of any agreed meaning and at a time when new technologies seem likely to replace books as we have known them since gutenberg this question is brought to bear deliberately on the touchstone examples the bible homer shakespeare also on kierkegaard and kafka the closely meshed collection ends with a series of essays on the philosophic theological underwriting of communication with particular reference to what language tells us of socrates and of jesus these essays by george steiner distinguished critic and extraordinary fellow at churchill college cambridge seek to conjoin the themes argued in such books as the death of tragedy language and silence after babel and real presences they speak of a profound if sometimes troubled joy

real presences argues that any understanding of the nature of language is based on the assumption of god s presence and discusses the influence of this on literary criticism

in contemporary societies privatization has long ceased to be just an economic concept rather it must increasingly be made to refer to the ongoing shrinking of the public space under the impact of the representation of individual lives and images which cuts across all discourses genres and media to become one of the primary means of production of culture this volume is intended to cover such an historical social and intellectual ground where self representation comes to the fore targeting mostly an academic readership but certainly also of interest to the general educated public it collects a wide range of essays dealing with diverse modes of life writing and portraying from a variety of perspectives and focusing on different historical periods and media it thus offers itself as a major contribution to a better understanding of the world we live in its past legacy and present configuration

this is very much not an academic book though it is as one would expect throughout infomed by steiner s vast and polyglot reading from the classics through to contemporary science across fiction poetry theology and philosophy it is rather in a genre of its own littered with entertaining anecdotes and the closest we will get to an autobiography

the king james version of the bible first published in 1611 has been the favorite of english readers for centuries this everyman s library edition of the old testament also contains george steiner s introduction which reminds us of the literary grandeur uniqueness and centrality of the bible what you have in hand is not a book it is the book that of course is what bible means it is the book which not only in western humanity defines the concept of a text all our other books however different in matter or method relate be it indirectly to this book of books all other books be they histories narrations of the imaginary codes of law moral treatises lyric poems dramatic dialogues theological philosophic meditations are like sparks often to be sure distant tossed by an incessant breath from a central fire in the western condition but also in other parts of the planet to

which the good book has been taken the bible largely informs our historical and social identity no other book is like it all other books are inhabited by the murmer of that distant source steiner underlines as well our great good fortune in being able to read the bible which has been translated in whole or in part into more than two thousand languages in the resplendent language of seventeenth century england this is the instrument of spenser of shakespeare of bacon of donne and the young milton it encompasses the organblasts of the queen s rhetoric sidney s intimacies of desire the lapidary lightness of ben jonson and the compaction of the early metaphysical poets it can command seduce enchant and think aloud as never before or since there could not have been a moment a climate of feeling and general discourse more apt to engender the two foremost constructs in the language shakespeare and the king james version

bringing together writers translators poets and leading scholars of cultural theory literary theory comparative literature philosophy history political science music studies and education the wounds of possibility aims to offer an in depth and wide ranging study of george steinerâ tm s imposing body of work this book is a timely volume of important essays on one of the most provocative thinkers critics and philosophers now writing during an era in which the question of the ethical and of the status of the work of art and its relation to the theological dimension has returned with renewed urgency steinerâ tm s work provides rich resources for reflection and it is hoped that the volume will stand on its own as a rich nuanced accompaniment to the reading of steinerâ tm s work with their broad range of thematic foci theoretical approaches and stunning constellations of quoted material from different backgrounds all the essays in the book try to reflect upon the relation between human identity and language ethics and literature philosophy and art and they all offer what we regard as being the most comprehensive engagement with steinerâ tm s work to date

hope what is it how do we get it is it part of being human is it something that carries us through hard times is it something illusory this book which stems from the 4th inter disciplinary net conference on hope probing the boundaries held in september 2008 at mansfield college in oxford england explores all of these questions and many more as a truly inter disciplinary venture this book approaches the theme of hope from the point of view of the philosophical theological political literary psychological and sociological and presents hope not just as an abstract theme to be pondered but as an aspect of human living and thinking that has a profound impact on our lives the conclusions reached in each chapter demonstrate the variety of ways in which hope is conceived as well as the tensions inherent in any discussion of the benefits of hope and the intricacies in dealing with hope on a theoretical and a practical level this book is perfect for anyone wondering where hope fits into our lives during these troubling times
