the ability to carry out research successfully has come to be seen as a key transferable skill required of all higher education students and the management of a student research project addresses directly the skill element of this furthermore the research process at all levels is far more systematized than in the past this is a hugely popular and highly successful textbook

action research is a popular part of many teacher training courses but understanding how to do it well is not always straightforward previously known as action research for new teachers this book will guide trainee teachers through each step of the process from initial stages of planning and research through to how to analyse data and write up a research project this second edition includes a new critical task feature with suggested responses discussion of where action research fits in the world of education research exploration of the skills and attributes needed for undertaking action research guidance on how to write with clarity and purpose
