drawing on many years experience in practice teaching and research mark rivett and eddy street present philosophical sociological and empirical views of family therapy balancing the perceived benefits against the potential limitations they pose questions which challenge those within the profession to think hard about their role does family therapy work can those most in need really be helped is family therapy a means of social control who does professionalization help while most texts offer a straightforward and uncritical perspective in contrast family therapy in focus aims to stimulate debate among practitioners and to help trainees adopt a more reflective and critical attitude towards their own professional development and the development of their profession

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the challenge facing the authors of texts that address the multiplicity and complexity of problems that may afflict families can be intimidating philip barker has addressed this challenge head on in each of the editions of this book this task has been greatly facilitated by the contributions of the new co author jeff chang and in this edition provides a clear easily read and readily understandable introduction to family therapy much has happened in the field of family therapy since the fifth edition of basic family therapy was published in 2007 new developments covered in this book include emotionally focused therapy the gottman approach to couples therapy mindfulness and psychotherapy the common factors approach to psychotherapy and to family therapy the increased emphasis on empirically supported treatments high conflict post divorce parenting basic family therapy will be of value to readers new to family therapy and to those in the early stages of training

this special edition of the classic text includes a new introduction from professor arlene vetere exploring its continuing influence on contemporary practice one of family therapy s foundational texts families and family therapy is as relevant today as it has ever been examining the therapist s role dr minuchin presents the views and strategies of a master clinician in a clear and practical form transcripts of actual family sessions both with families meeting their problems fairly successfully and those seeking help are accompanied by a running interpretation of what is taking place the book constructs a model of an effectively functioning family and defining the boundaries around its different subsystems whether parental spouse or sibling it then explores the ways in which families adapt to stress from within and without as they seek to survive and grow combining vivid clinical examples specific details of technique and mature perspectives on both effectively functioning families and those seeking therapy this is an important text for all those interesting in the theory and practice of family therapy this book can be used on courses such as family therapy family interventions systemic practice and systemic counselling within departments of psychology mental health and counselling and by undergraduate students on social work qualifying courses

this book focuses on students a pragmatic approach to treatment regard for multidisciplinary perspectives and respect for the influence of families on clients chapter 1 identifies concerns that new therapists frequently have such as building confidence in their clinical work chapters 2 6 follow the usual time sequence of therapy from initial contact with clients to comprehensive assessment to treatment planning and intervention chapters 7 10

deal with specific clinical situations based on presenting problems and the nature of client families we examine major issues and approaches for working with children and adolescents older adults couples and families that are struggling with serious mental illness chapter 11 highlights some common obstacles all therapists encounter and provides concrete ideas on how to get unstuck when treatment is not progressing chapter 12 focuses on an often overlooked part of therapy termination in chapter 13 we conclude the book by looking at emerging issues within family therapy

originally published in 1981 this volume presents papers by the leading british theorists and practitioners in family therapy from its beginnings up to the 1980s it collected together for the first time a number of important previously published articles which had relevance and interest for family therapists of the day and includes other chapters specially written for this book which reflected the most recent thinking on the topics covered at the time the book is divided into three parts the first which includes papers by john bowlby r d laing and a c r skynner deals with the theory behind family therapy in the second part we see the application of family therapy to specific clinical situations such as adolescent psychiatry illness death and mourning in the family and marital therapy the third part of the book covers various differential approaches within family therapy including psychoanalysis the experiential approach and family construct psychology the papers in all three parts weld together ideas from the behavioural and the psychodynamic spheres of interest addressed as they are to theoretical issues and clinical applications they linked together the past and future of family therapy at that time
