reuven ben vosef 1937 2001 was born robert eliot reiss to an assimilated jewish family in new york he switched from writing english poetry to hebrew poetry after his immigration to israel in 1959 he is the author of more than a dozen volumes of superb hebrew poetry as well as two collections of essays and two novels and he won literary honors such as the levi eshkol prize the bar ilan university prize and the neuman and kovner prizes for hebrew literature at the center of his oeuvre is the sequence of poems he wrote in the 1970s called mikhtavim la amerikah letters to america a searing and confessional set of addresses in the form of letters to his family members none of whom however could read hebrew and to american jewry as a whole in this edited volume weingrad includes not only these expertly translated poems but also an extensive fascinating introduction that helps us see ben yosef s personal poetry as part of a larger family story while ben yosef was writing about his american family members they were writing about him ben yosef s younger brother poet james reiss began publishing highly praised collections of poems in the 1970s and addressed conflicts with his brother in a number of poems ben yosef s brother in law novelist william luvaas published a first novel that was clearly based upon the reiss family ben yosef s letters to america are therefore joined by his family members letters to israel through which the reiss family collectively created its own literature of the american israeli relationship in miniature the conflicts and rifts rivalries and loyalties of family members and competing homelands this essential introduction which also describes ben yosef s early life as an american and the challenges of becoming an israeli poet writing in hebrew enriches our understanding of the deeply personal poems collected in the rest of the volume weingrad compellingly argues that ben yosef s poems though seemingly local in their explicit israeli audience and address implicitly speak to jews in america about assimilation heritage and the struggle between competing identities

in the transatlantic world of the late eighteenth century easterly winds blew radical thought to america thomas paine had already arrived on these shores in 1774 and made his mark as a radical pamphleteer during the revolution in his wake followed more than 200 other radical exiles english dissenters whigs and painites scottish lads o parts and irish patriots who became influential newspaper writers and editors and helped change the nature of political discourse in a young nation michael durey has written the first full scale analysis of these radicals evaluating the long term influence their ideas have had on american political thought transatlantic radicals uncovers the roots of their radicalism in the old world and tells the story of how these men came to be exiled how they emigrated and how they participated in the politics of their adopted country nearly all of these radicals looked to paine as their spiritual leader and to thomas jefferson as their political champion they held egalitarian anti federalist values and promoted an extreme form of participatory democracy that found a niche in the radical wing of jefferson's republican party their divided views on slavery however reveal that democratic republicanism was unable to cope with the realities of that institution as political activists during the 1790s they proved

crucial to jefferson s 1800 presidential victory then after his views moderated and their influence waned many repatriated others drifted into anonymity and a few managed to find success in the new world although many of these men are known to us through other histories their influence as a group has never before been so closely examined durey persuasively demonstrates that the intellectual ferment in britain did indeed have tremendous influence on american politics his account of that influence sheds considerable light on transatlantic political history and differences in religious political and economic freedoms skillfully balancing a large cast of characters transatlantic radicals depicts the diversity of their experiences and shows how crucial these reluctant  $\square$ migr $\square$ s were to shaping our republic in its formative years

further the book also shows the year black slavery started something almost all textbooks got wrong it also shows who was the fi rst black slave in america something no textbook ever mentions it also shows when and how racism started in america and many other very sensitive and embarrassing but necessary issues that america avoids but must be frankly discussed for america to move forward this book therefore shatters the two dominant themes of americas history and sociology that blacks were brought into america in chains as slaves while whites came to america in search of freedom as harvard educated president obama famously told us in his race speech thus the crowning lesson of this book in addition to discussing some critical policy issues like education health care etc is that it discovers the centripetal force of the american society that eluded contemporary americans because american bosses have laboriously concealed the facts from the public the scary but clearly healthy uniting fact that most americans are united by their common ancestry their universal history and experience of servitude bond indentures and slavery nothing is more universal more common and more shared in american history and sociology than the fact that most of our ancestors black and white were servants bond indentures and slaves who were dominated and super exploited by few overlords colonial america was the preferred dumping ground for british outcasts rejects criminals masterless class vagabonds bond indentures slaves etc until 1776 when australia replaced america as the british dump for its rejects and surplus citizens thus that america was a nation founded by british rejects and losers is inherently more rational than the prevailing orthodoxy or the obama theory of americas founders that they were great honorable men who journeyed across the ocean for freedom because of the obvious reason that good powerful achieving citizens do not normally emigrate to new uncharted lands
