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ordained as a priest antonio lucio vivaldi became one of europe s most popular composers during the early part of the eighteenth century he wrote hundreds of concertos dozens of operas and many sacred works before his music fell out of fashion during the latter part of his life he died in obscurity and his work suffered a similar fate for

almost two centuries his music was rescued from oblivion in the 1930s his most famous work the four seasons has since become one of the best selling classical compositions of all time

born in venice italy antonio vivaldi was one of the most influential and highly regarded baroque composers although his fame blazed only briefly he is most remembered for his concertos particularly the four seasons but his overall production was enormous ranging from orchestral and vocal music for both secular and church settings as well as opera scores and libretti in addition vivaldi was a master violinist and spent much of his career as an instructor at a famous institution for girls the hospital of mercy he was educated as a priest but poor health and probably a lack of interest in the calling encouraged him to follow another path in life during his lifetime the red haired virtuoso and opera impresario was easily among the most famous musicians in italy this fame eventually extended throughout civilized europe his name was sufficient to open doors to the richest and most powerful people in the western world before his death however his heyday had long passed after an extended period of obscurity the music of vivaldi underwent a revival in the early 20th century this book is vivaldi s incredible story

detailed survey of vivaldi s unjustly neglected chamber cantatas showing them to stand comparison with his more famous works vivaldi s chamber cantatas for solo voice some forty in total are steadily gaining in popularity but because of their relatively small place in the oeuvre of a composer famed for his productivity and also on account of the general scholarly neglect of their genre they are little discussed in the literature this book comprehensively explores their literary and musical background their relation to the composer s biography the chronology of their composition and their musical qualities each cantata is discussed individually but there is also a broader consideration of aspects concerning them collectively such as performance practice topical allusion and the conventions of italian verse the author argues that while vivaldi s cantatas are not as innovative as his concertos and operas he produced several masterpieces in the genre that rank with his best music michael talbot is emeritus professor of music at the university of liverpool

antonio vivaldi the red priest of baroque music is the biography of antonio vivaldi he was a venetian priest and baroque music composer as well as a famous virtuoso violinist he was born and raised in the republic of venice the four seasons a series of four violin concertos is his best known work and a highly popular baroque music piece vivaldi is considered one of the composers who brought baroque music to evolve into a classical style at the height of his career vivaldi received commissions from european nobles and royalty vivaldi s life like those of many composers of the time ended in financial difficulties antonio vivaldi the red priest of baroque music is highly recommended for those interested in reading more about this priest and talented musician

chronicles the life of the seventeenth century composer and discusses his major works including the four seasons

this study of vivaldi's late operas grew out of an interest not so much in vivaldi but in baroque opera in general on examining the position of research into this genre a few years ago it appeared that most of the important composers in this field had been investigated to some degree with the exception of vivaldi as mario rinaldi has shown in his survey of vivaldi research the vocal works were neglected until the last few years and despite the impetus provided by the tercentenary of his birth in 1978 the balance has not yet been restored considering the popularity of his instrumental works it seemed rather unfair that his theatrical music should be virtually ignored an interesting comparison can be made here with haydn and so the present work aims to throw some light onto this side of his activities for practical reasons it was impossible to take into account all the surviving operatic fragments scattered throughout the libraries of europe however as all the most important manuscripts are housed in turin these formed the basis of this study with the addition of six arias from ercole su l termidonte in a manuscript in the biblioth que du conservatoire national de musique paris further restrictions however were still necessary and so as many of the later works use librettos by leading figures such as zeno and metastasio these mature operas dating from 1727 onwards seemed the most obvious on which to concentrate one opera griselda has been singled out for particular attention on account of the available information concerning the adaptation of zeno's libretto and vivaldi's score of this work has recently been reproduced in the garland series of facsimiles of italian opera most of the work that has been done on the operas so far has tended to approach them from the point of view of the concertos constantly drawing parallels between the two styles there are obviously many connections but for the most part this investigation has tried to view them as dramatic works in their own right the way in which vivaldi as a man of the theatre would surely have regarded them from preface

the four seasons were composed by antonio vivaldi an italian composer these are four violin concertos that give musical expression to the seasons of the year it was published as il cimento dell'armonia e dell'invenzione the contest between harmony and invention the compositions were a revolution in musical concepts each concerto included sonnets poems possibly written by vivaldi and in his work he demonstrated musical representation of singing birds buzzing flies barking dogs storms landscapes and warm winter fires the four seasons violin concerto no 1 in e major rv 269 la primavera spring i allegro ii largo iii danza pastorale violin concerto no 2 in g minor rv 315 l'estate summer i allegro non molto ii adagio e piano presto e forte iii presto violin concerto no 3 in f major rv 293 l'autunno autumn i allegro ii adagio molto iii allegro violin concerto no 4 in f minor rv 297 l'inverno winter i allegro non molto ii largo iii allegro these four violin concertos have been arranged for the piano the sonnets are included before each concerto and i hope you enjoy getting to know the perfect harmony between music and poetry

famous as a violinist as well as a composer impresario and teacher antonio vivaldi produced over 500 concertos in his lifetime paul paradise has selected and edited eight vivaldi concertos for string orchestra or string quartet the pieces were chosen to provide each player with a meaningful part and have been edited with contemporary fingerings and bowings contents are concerto in re maggiore 246 concerto in re minore 176 concerto in la minore 411 concerto in fa maggiore 288 concerto in sol minore 287 concerto in la minore 413

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tonal space in the music of antonio vivaldi incorporates an analytical study of vivaldi s style into a more general exploration of harmonic and tonal organization in the music of the late italian baroque the harmonic and tonal language of vivaldi and his contemporaries full of curious links between traditional modal thinking and what would later be considered common practice major minor tonality directly reflects the historical circumstances of the shifting attitude toward the conceptualization of tonal space so crucial to western art music vivaldi is examined in a completely new context allowing both his prosaic and idiosyncratic sides to emerge clearly this book contributes to a better understanding of vivaldi s individual style while illuminating wider processes of stylistic development and the diffusion of artistic ideas in the 18th century

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
